Serving as your International President for the two years of Covid, seeing so many of our Motorcades not filling necessitating many cancellations were very disheartening. Last year we were faced with a decision I never want to repeat. For the first time, we had little choice but to cancel GrandVention. Before I continue let me assure you, we will NOT be cancelling GrandVention this year.

This year, with inflation and record setting energy costs, we experienced many cancellations once again. For the biannual Magical Maritimes Motorcade, it wasn't possible after record cancellations. We did a breakeven analysis when reservations fell below 15 coaches and adjusted the cost accordingly. With the adjustment, reservations fell to just five forcing the cancellation.

Why am I explaining this to you? Simple.... you deserve to know the process and the agony your leadership experiences in making these difficult decisions. These decisions are not taken lightly.

With Covid becoming a part of our lives like the annual flu, most have adjusted their lives and are returning to our pre-covid routines. As of today, we have 70 reservations for Grandvention. rampant Covid.

SERVICE NEWS Mark & Donna Crick

Well it's finally summer again and travel is on our minds. Yes, I know it's going to cost more this year than ever before, but after the past few years, What the Heck! I'm itching to hit the road and hoping you are too. As a longtime fellow Foretraveler once told me and I quote, "Sonny, (I was younger then) you can get more money, but you can't get more time! Besides, you only get to travel thru life once, and it just costs a little more to go first class. Now believe me when I tell you that the Foretravel way of life is definitely First Class!" That kind gentleman passed away a few short years after telling me that, but he was full timing in his new Foretravel and wasn't worried about the cost, he was Living Life!

Last time, if you remember, we talked about the engine air compressor and how it supplies air for our brake and suspension systems as we travel down the road. Now if you are like me and love to drive your Foretravel, than you know that the "TRIP" is all about the journey and not about the destination. But sooner or later you have to stop, which might have you wondering "How does that same air system that takes me down the road, work to keep us level when I am parked, and the engine air compressor is no longer running?" Well, that question takes us to the HWH system and its components.

Ever since Foretravel went to their Air Ride Chassis, there has been an auxiliary air tank and 12 volt air compressor system. Like the engine compressor, it too gains moisture as it compresses air so its system has water collection bowls, a purge valve of sorts, and some systems even have a

bowl filled with a desiccant agent that dries the compressed air as it travels through it, prior to reaching its air tank. This tank also has a drain valve and is located with the other brake tank valves. Be sure to drain any moisture from its tank when purging the others.

This system's sole function is to supply compressed air to the HWH Leveling system and slide outs, if you have them, whenever you are parked and no longer in travel mode. Its 12 volt motor gets its power from your coach batteries which are kept charged by way of your on board Invertor/charger when plugged into shore power or by the generator when it's operating.

The compressor is controlled by a pressure switch that is set to maintain approximately 60 to 95 PSI in the auxiliary air tank at all times. Anytime the air pressure drops below its lower set point, the pressure switch will close and send 12 volts to the compressor motor, and it will run until it reaches its upper set limit, where the pressure switch will open and stop current flow to the motor. The way this system is designed, it doesn't care if the coach is trying to level or not, it just knows to run between its set points. It will also come on any time the coach tries to raise. This will happen when in auto level mode and the computer is re-leveling the coach or when in manual mode and you press an up button. At this point, it doesn't really care how much pressure is in the tank. The compressor will run to supplement the air tank as long as a raise command is given. Under normal conditions this compressor will run for approximately 4 to 5 minutes to maintain pressure in its tank. Mine



will cycle on 4 to 6 times a day even in a level campsite. Under no condition should it be allowed to run more than 6 minutes without a 30 minute rest to keep it from overheating.

I have talked to many people that have either installed a switch on the auxiliary compressor pump motor or pulled the fuse to keep it from running. If it runs too long or too often, there's no doubt you have leaks in the system and the compressor is getting weak, or both.

You can trouble shoot your own system with a spray bottle of soapy water if so inclined. Just spray the solution on fittings and lines at the compressor and bowls and watch for bubbles. Don't venture under your coach for any reason unless you have it properly blocked up. Also remember that if you have disabled the compressor, it needs to be operational in order to create a vacuum in the slide out system so you can move the rooms in and out.

I hope this information helps answer some questions about your auxiliary air compressor and how it works. For more information on this and lots of other stuff, come join us on a Motorcade soon. The "Boost" **Switch**

Just about every motorized RV has a "Boost" switch. It may be called something else such as "Emergency Start" or "Merge", but the function is the same. Imagine that both house and engine batteries have a positive cable from the positive post that runs to a relay. That relay normally does not connect those two cables together unless the relay is energized by the RV operator. That is usually accomplished by activating a switch near the dashboard. Sometimes the switch is "momentary", meaning you must hold

the switch depressed as it is spring loaded and will return to off when released. Other times. the switch is off/on like in Foretravels, but they both do the same thing. The latter switch will keep the batteries hooked together until the switch is turned back off. Merging the batteries together will allow either a dead chassis battery power to start the coach engine or provide chassis battery power to dead house batteries.

It takes voltage from the dash switch to this low-volt relay in order to activate it so the set of batteries providing this voltage cannot be completely dead. That voltage is normally provided from the house batteries as it



is more critical to be able to start the main engine. If the main engine can be successfully started, the alternator can provide needed charging for both sets. Also, if the coach is plugged in to shore power or generator is running, the on-board converter will provide charging to the chassis batteries and not just the house batteries.

If the operator leaves the dash switch on, the engine batteries can overcharge or the house batteries can as well. The boost switch is for emergency use, but it's not fail-safe.

POLICIES RESERVATIONS

A \$500.00 deposit per event is required at the time of reservation. Full payment is due 90 days prior to the activity start date. A second deposit may be required and is due upon billing. Reservations may be made by mail or telephone by using your MasterCard, Visa, or Discover credit card. Failure to make required payments will result in losing your place in the sign-up rotation.

CANCELLATIONS/REFUNDS

If reservations are canceled 90 days before the event, your deposits will be refunded less any unrecoverable monies retained by vendors from deposits made on member's behalf. If cancellation falls within 90 days prior to the beginning of the activity, 20% of the fees paid will be retained to cover the cost of postage, printing, supplies, bank charges, etc., plus any charges for any actual cost from guarantees and/or deposits made on member's behalf. No shows can result in no refunds. All refunds (except in very serious cases) will be charged 20% of the event fee plus actual cost from guarantees and/or deposits made on member's behalf. Some special events have their own cancellation policies.

GUESTS

Arrangements and/or registration for all guests should be made upon registration or no later than 90 days prior to the start of any event.

STANDBY LIST

Space is limited on many events. All reservations are recorded in the order initial deposits are received. If received on the same day, they are handled in a lottery style manner. When a cancellation occurs, the first on the standby list is notified to fill the opening. Do not hesitate to sign up when discovering there is a standby list for an event. Very seldom have we had any standbys remaining at the start of an event.

SCOUTING AN EVENT

This occurs approximately one year prior to running the event. Pricing and finalizing with confirmation of all tours and attractions for each event take approximately four to six months after scouting is completed. Dates are tentative. Pricing and confirmed dates will be published in the Motorcader magazine.

Jweet & Spicy Pineapple Jalmon

INGREDIENTS

2-2.5 lbs. salmon

Salt and pepper, to taste

2 (8 oz.) cans pineapple slices, drained (reserve juice for glaze)

1/2 cup sweet chili sauce

2 tablespoons rice vinegar

1 tablespoon soy sauce

1 tablespoon brown sugar

1/4 cup pineapple juice

Chopped fresh cilantro, for garnish

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Line a baking sheet with foil. Spray with non-stick cooking spray.
- 2. Lay salmon on foil and season with salt and pepper. Arrange pineapple slices under and/or around edges of salmon. Fold edges of foil up around the salmon and pineapple.
- 3. In a small bowl, whisk together sweet chili sauce, rice vinegar, soy sauce, brown sugar and pineapple juice. Pour glaze over salmon.
- 4. Bake for 12-15 minutes. Switch oven to broil and cook for an additional 4-5 minutes, or until edges of salmon just begin to blacken.
- 5. Sprinkle with chopped fresh cilantro before serving, if desired.

One Pot Spaghetti Carbonara

INGREDIENTS

4 slices bacon

1 large shallot or 1 small yellow onion, chopped (about 1/2 cup)

1 can (10 1/2 ounces) Campbell's(r) Condensed Cream of Chicken Soup or 98% Fat Free Cream of Chicken Soup



3 1/2 cups Swanson(r) Natural Goodness(r) Chicken Broth

1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese or Pecorino Romano cheese


8 ounces uncooked spaghetti

1 cup frozen peas, thawed

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Cook the bacon in a 6-quart saucepot or Dutch oven over medium-high heat for 5 minutes or until the bacon is crisp. Remove the bacon and drain on paper towels. Pour off all but 1 tablespoon drippings. Add the shallot to the drippings in the saucepot and cook and stir for 1 minute.
- 2. Stir in the soup, broth and cheese and heat to a boil. Stir in the uncooked spagnetti. Reduce the heat to medium-low and cook for 10 minutes or until the spaghetti is tender and the soup mixture is thickened, stirring occasionally. Stir in the peas. Crumble the bacon and add.

Season to taste with salt and black pepper. Sprinkle with additional cheese just before serving, if desired.






