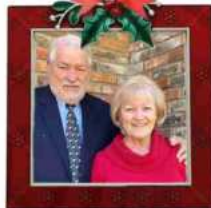

# SERVICE NEWS

## Mark & Donna Crick

Donna and I just got home from a wonderful fall family reunion. The reunion I am speaking of was the 2022 Grandvention held in Branson Missouri. To most of us seasoned Motorcadars, it is the one time each year that we get to see our old friends, catch up on our travel experiences, and plan where we will be going with each other on Motorcades for the next year or so.

This year there were about 85 coaches at Grandvention and I think we only knew about half of you. With so many new faces to meet and names to remember, I am really glad we all wear those badges so we can keep everyone straight.

Every time we show up with the "Service Trailer" at events or on Motorcades, we always get plenty of questions on how different systems on our coach work. As you may or may not know, everything in Branson is on a hill, even our RV campsites, so our HWH leveling systems really got a workout.

Since one of the questions I got many times was "What is that popping noise coming from my electronics bay", I thought a little review of the HWH leveling system might be in order.

When I pull into an RV site for the night, the first thing I do is shift to neutral and set the parking brake. The HWH leveling system will not

activate if the parking brake is not engaged. I then push the Air button twice to activate the auto-leveling mode. The coach will begin to level by exhausting air from the airbags. The system always levels down first. If a level position is not achieved by lowering the high side or end of the coach, then the low side or end will be raised by adding air to the appropriate airbags. When all 4 yellow level sensing lights are off, the leveling is complete and the system will go into sleep mode. This is when I shut off the engine. I leave the engine on when initially leveling to take advantage of the engine air compressor to help raise the coach if needed. Once in sleep mode, the processor will "wake up" every 30 minutes and recheck for level, re-adjust if needed, then return to sleep.

If, as was the case in Branson, the RV site is really unlevelled, the HWH system will attempt to level the coach for approximately 15 to 20 minutes. If in that length of time it cannot get level and turn out all 4 yellow sensing lights, the system will shut down and go into "excess slope." When this happens, the excess slope light will be lit. When the excess slope light is on, be aware that the HWH system will not let the slide-out rooms extended. But if they are already out, they can be retracted. Not to worry, the excess slope light can be reset by

releasing the parking brake with the ignition switch on.

Oh yes, and that popping noise? Sometimes when things are really out of level and the air pump is working overtime trying to get things level just before it goes into excess slope, the air pump will reach its maximum output and the pressure relief valve will expel excess pressure sounding like a 22 pistol going off. If this happens, don't panic. Simply go to the leveling control panel and push the "off" or the "emergency stop" button, whichever the case may be. It's now time to get out the leveling blocks or move to a more level-friendly site. Either way, it sure is nice knowing that about 95% of the time a level coach is just a couple of taps away on that HWH air button.

# TECH TALK

## WINTER TIPS

If you stay in your RV in a campground or otherwise have it hooked to water during freezing weather you need to be aware of the possibility that the water hose that feeds your unit is susceptible to freezing unless you provide some protection. It's still a disaster if you are freeze protected inside but you can't get any water TO the unit.

I went to Lowe's Home Improvement and bought a hose fitting so that I could shorten my hose. No need to try to freeze protect 25 feet of hose if all I need to reach my unit is 12 feet! Next, I found 120 volt heat in the plumbing section tape in

various lengths. It comes equipped with a built in thermostat that makes the tape begin heating around 32 degrees F. I bought a 12' roll. I also bought 12' of 1" ID foam pipe insulation. I wrapped the hose in aluminum foil, then I wrapped the heat tape around my hose securing it with zip ties and then wrapped the hose in the pipe insulation. I left enough heat tape exposed at the faucet end that I could wrap the exposed faucet too. Voila! Freezing weather? Bring it on!

All together cost the was about \$20.00. I've seen heated hoses in RV stores selling for upward of \$300.00

If your coach is equipped with a diesel fired heat system and you park the unit inside, you need to remember to shut

off the diesel burner AND your generator auto-start. Diesel exhaust will wreak havoc on your unit if that heater comes on or if the building loses power and the generator fires up because batteries go down.

If you park outside, get your wipers away from the windshield (s) to prevent them from becoming frozen to the glass. A tennis ball under each wiper arm usually will do the job.

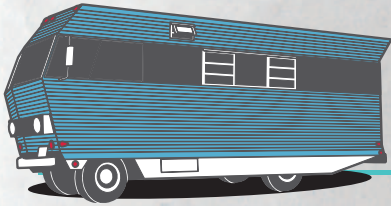

### Event Dates

# Cooking

## THE FORETRAVEL WAY

Our tradition this time of the year is to request recipes from our outgoing and incoming International First Ladies. I think we're in for a real treat with their choices. It looks like Ineke and Linda are going to have our kitchens smelling 'delicious'!! - Bev Koonce

### Bacon, Egg, and Cheese Enchiladas

#### Ingredient

- Cooking spray, for the baking dish
- 10 pieces cooked bacon, crumbled, + more for serving
- 1/2 (8oz) bag shredded Mexican 4 Cheese (about 1C)
- 8 (8") flour tortillas
- 12 Lg eggs
- 1/3 C whole milk
- Kosher salt
- 1 (10oz) can red or green sauce
- 1 (8oz) Mexican blend cheese shredded (about 2 C)
- Green onion, thinly sliced (garnish)



#### Directions

1. Preheat oven to 350° with a rack in the upper third. Grease a 9-by-13 baking dish with cooking spray.
2. In a medium bowl combine bacon and 1/2 bag of shredded Mexican 4 Cheese. Divide among tortillas.
3. Loosely roll each tortilla up and arrange them seam-side down in a single layering prepared baking dish, ends facing the long sides of the dish (tortillas should be just loose enough to gill up the pan as if they were filled enchiladas).
4. In a large bowl whisk eggs, milk, and 1/2 teaspoon salt. Rather than pouring the egg mixture over the top of the tortillas, pour it down the long sides of the baking dish, so it can fill into the rolled tortillas. Tilt the baking dish a bit to evenly distribute egg mixture inside the rolled tortillas.
5. Cover baking dish with foil and bake until eggs are just set, about 35 minutes. Uncover and top with enchiladas sauce and the 2 C shredded Mexican blend cheese. Switch oven to broil and broil until cheese is just melted and golden, 2-4 minutes more. Sprinkle with green onion and remaining slice of crumbled bacon and serve.
